



# Green Teacher Network

The **Green Teacher Network** (GTN) is a powerful collaboration of three Garfield Park Conservatory Alliance, Openlands, and Chicago Botanic Garden. GTN's major goal is to fulfill multiple related needs: those of the schools and teachers to find more creative ways to engage and educate their students; to ensure that school gardens remain viable by connecting them to the indoor classroom; and those of the students to learn basic information and skills in core subjects. Teachers need not have a school garden to benefit from this rich resource of green activities.

Green Teacher Network (GTN) serves instructors at Chicago-area schools by providing professional development for plant-based education. Workshops aim to integrate gardens into each school's curriculum over a broad spectrum of subjects. GTN has provided workshops to more than 800 teachers from hundreds of schools, teaching in grades K-12. CPDUs are given for participation in each workshop.



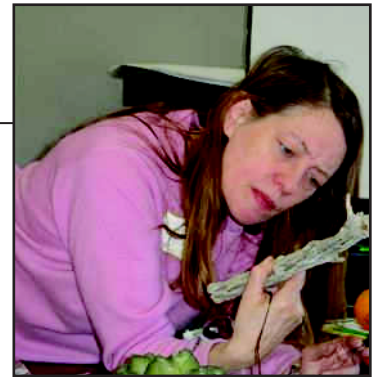
